

Apple Volume Licence Program

What is the Apple Volume Licence Program (AVLP)?

LT Scotland is working with Apple to offer Scottish education access to the Apple Volume Licence Program (AVLP). By purchasing through this scheme, Scottish education has access to tiered pricing with a low minimum entry requirement. The more you purchase the more you save.

How does the scheme work?

Schools are able to purchase full packs, or Volume Licence Packs. Manuals and CD-ROMs can be purchased separately. However, they will not be supplied in excess of the number of licences purchased.

With the AVLP (Apple Volume Licence Program), the licence gives you the right to use Apple software on a specified number of computers at your institution or education office.

Prices are based on the number of licences you are purchasing for each software title. For most products, volume pricing starts at just 10 licences.
